Project: East Mesa Juvenile Detention Facility
Client: City of San Diego
Project Costs: \$42,600,000

Juvenile Detention Facility a new 185,000 SF, \$42.6-million dollar prison. The design included housing pods for general population living units with separate recreation yards; administrative segregation; a medical and mental health clinic; intake, booking and release; central security and control; a maintenance shop; a warehouse and food preparation with a 3,500-square-foot warming kitchen, and administration and staff support areas.



ESTIMATING

Project: Growlersburg Conservation Camp
Client: Department of General Services
Project Costs: \$45,534,000

The buildings to be included are: Staff Administrative Office, BOQs; Inmate barracks, mess hall/kitchen/food storage, inmate recreation building, exercise & hobby facilities for 132 inmates; inmate multipurpose facility; Inmate staging area facility to include outdoor showers; toilets for cover fire crews; warehouse facility for fire equipment & supplies, water & sewage plant operator office, upholstery shop, maintenance shop, & welding shop, 4-bay autoshop, repair shop with heavy equipment mechanic office; cabinet/carpenter shop.
